Zimbabwean umpire visit to Tasmania a hit

In accordance with Cricket Tasmania's policy to welcome umpires from anywhere in the world to be involved in its training programs, Zimbabwean first-class umpire Jeremiah Matibiri worked closely with the CT Umpiring Department from November through to February 2010.

Cricket Tasmania State Director of Umpiring Richard Widows said that during his time spent in Tasmania, Jeremiah enthusiastically embraced all opportunities offered to him to broaden and benefit his overall experience.

"Jeremiah has had a passion for umpiring and coaching cricket for over 12 years. He has been Chairman of the Umpires and Scorers Association in Harare and is currently working on a program at a provincial level in Mashonaland, Zimbabwe, with an aim to raise the profile of cricket and increase the number of accredited umpires in the country.

"This season, he was appointed to TCA first grade games since round seven and umpired all eight first grade teams and also helped out in the lower grades on

Sundays, as well as the mid-week TCA Twenty20 competition and various underage competitions; it was a pleasure to have Jerry work with us," Mr Widows said.

Jeremiah also took an active part in the training workshops conducted for umpires weekly at Bellerive Oval and will take back Australian standard training material to Zimbabwe where he is involved in the training of local umpires.

Umpiring in Tasmania has seen some high achievements this year already with Sam Nogajski appointed as 3rd Umpire in both the January 27 and February 13 Ford Ranger Cups at Bellerive Oval. Steven John took to the field in his first Sheffield Shield match with Ian Lock in February and was appointed for the last Sheffield Shield match at Bellerive with Australian International umpire Rod Tucker, another official who started his umpiring career in Tasmania.

The women's Twenty20 International series will see Australia and New Zealand fight it out at Bellerive Oval on the 21st, 22nd and 23rd of February and Tasmanian umpires will again be recognised with Steven John, Sam Nogajski and Nick McGann appointed to these matches.

Dress Code

Members and accompanying cardholders are reminded of Cricket Tasmania's dress code as set out in the current edition of the Members' Handbook.

Cricket Tasmania requires that a reasonable standard of dress, consistent with being a member of a major sporting association attending a prestige venue, is maintained by both its Members and their guests. A minimum standard of neat, casual attire is:

Gentleman Members, Adult guests and Boys 12 years-plus:

- Tailored slacks (track-suits are unacceptable);
- Denim or cotton long trousers (torn, ragged or holed are unacceptable);
- Dress shorts worn with substantial leather sandals or closed shoes;
- Polo-shirts or collared shirts;
- Closed footwear in a clean and neat condition;
- Wearing of hats is not acceptable inside the Members' Area, but may be worn in the outside seating area.

Lady Members, Adult guests and Girls 12 years-plus:

- Tailored slacks/skirts (track-suits are unacceptable);
- Denim or cotton long trousers (torn, ragged or holed are unacceptable);
- Dress shorts worn with substantial leather sandals or closed shoes;
- Shirts and dress T-shirts (skimpy tops are unacceptable);
- Wearing of hats is not acceptable inside the Members' Area, but may be worn in the outside seating area.

Thongs (casual or fashion), stubbie or football shorts, tee-shirts and singlets are not acceptable. Casual footwear, which is not in a clean and neat condition, is not acceptable.

It is at the discretion of Cricket Tasmania staff to seek removal of, or deny admittance to, any Member or guest if clothing or footwear worn is considered to be inappropriate or offensive.

To avoid embarrassment, Members are reminded that they are responsible for their Ancillary card users' and guests' behaviour and attire.

Overflow seats available

In anticipation of the Members' Pavilion being filled to capacity for the Twenty20 on 21st February, Cricket Tasmania has allocated a limited number of seats in the Southern Stand to accommodate the overflow from the Members Pavilion. As seating in the Southern Stand is reserved members will be required to visit the Match Day Office (ground floor to the left of the Pavilion entrance) to be issued a ticket to a designated seat. This will occur when it becomes clear the Members' Pavilion is full.

The seats will be allocated on the basis of one seat per current Full Member cardholder and one seat for an accompanying Associate/Lady's/Gentleman's cardholder.

Car parking is available at St Mark's Church, corner Church and Scott Streets, Bellerive.
